The Buchanan County Board of Supervisors reconvened in regular session at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, February 1, 2010 with Ralph Kremer, Chairperson in the Chair, Ellen Gaffney and Mike Ferreter present. Absent, none.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Ferreter second by Gaffney to approve the minutes of the January 25th and 28th meetings. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Gaffney second by Ferreter to approve claims filed with the County Auditor for payment in the amount of \$548,826.25. All in favor, motion carried.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE PROCEEDINGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT AND BORROW MONEY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$200,000

The Board of Supervisors of Buchanan County, Iowa, will meet on the 22nd day of February, 2010, in the Supervisors' Chambers, Courthouse, Independence, Iowa at 10:00 a.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and borrowing money in the principal amount of not to exceed \$200,000 for the purpose of lending the funds to the Buchanan County E911 Board to be used for upgrading E911 communication equipment.

The Loan Agreement is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Section 331.402 of the Code of Iowa. The Loan Agreement will not constitute a general obligation of the County but will be payable solely from the revenues paid to the county under an agreement with the Buchanan County E911 Board.

At the aforementioned time and place, oral or written objections may be filed or made to the proposal to enter into the Loan Agreement. After receiving objections, the County may determine to enter into the Loan Agreement, in which case, the decision will be final unless appealed to the District Court within fifteen (15) days thereafter.

RESOLUTION 10-15

**AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A LOAN AGREEMENT AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A
\$166,000 E911 TELEPHONE SURCHARGE REVENUE NOTE**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 331.402 of the Code of Iowa, the Board of Supervisors of Buchanan County, Iowa (the "County"), has heretofore proposed to contract indebtedness and enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") to provide funds to pay the cost, to that extent, of acquiring equipment for the County E911 Commission and has published notice and held a hearing on such proposal; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary at this time to authorize and approve the Loan Agreement and to make provision for the issuance of an E911 Telephone Surcharge Revenue Note (the "Note") in evidence of the obligation of the County under the Loan Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Buchanan County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby determines to enter into the Loan Agreement with Security State Bank, Independence, Iowa, as lender (the "Lender"), providing for a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$166,000 for the purpose set forth in the preamble hereof.

The Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to sign the Loan Agreement on behalf of the County, and the Loan Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 2. The Note is hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$166,000, and shall be dated as of the date of its delivery to the Lender and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in the manner hereinafter specified.

Buchanan County (the "County"), State of Iowa, for value received, promises to pay in the manner hereinafter provided to

or registered assigns, the principal sum of ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS, together with interest on the outstanding principal hereof from the date of this Note, or from the most recent payment date on which interest has been paid, except as the provisions hereinafter set forth with respect to prepayment prior to maturity may be or become applicable hereto.

This Note shall bear interest at the rate of 2.8% per annum. Principal of and interest on this Note shall be payable in equal quarterly installments, on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1 of each year, as shown on the payment schedule attached hereto.

Both principal of and interest on this Note are payable to the registered owner appearing on the registration books of the County maintained by the County Auditor (hereinafter referred to as the "Registrar" or the "Paying Agent") at the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the payment date in lawful money of the United States of America by check or draft mailed to the registered owner at the address shown on such registration books; provided, however, that the final installment of principal and interest shall be payable only upon presentation and surrender of this Note to the Paying Agent.

This Note is issued by the County to evidence its obligation under a certain Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement") entered into by the County for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring equipment for the County E911 Commission.

This Note is issued pursuant to and in strict compliance with the provisions of Section 331.402 of the Code of Iowa, 2009, and all other laws amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and in conformity with a resolution of the County Board of Supervisors authorizing and approving the Loan Agreement and providing for the issuance and securing the payment of this Note (the "Resolution"), and reference is hereby made to the Resolution and the Loan Agreement for a more complete statement as to the source of payment of this Note and the rights of the owner of this Note.

This Note will not constitute a general obligation of the County but will be payable solely and only from E911 Telephone Surcharge revenues received by the County from the County E911 Commission (the "E911 Revenues"). In and by the Resolution, the County Board of Supervisors has covenanted to appropriate the E911 Revenues in each year so long as this Note is outstanding in a sufficient amount to pay interest on and principal of this Note as such payments become due and has pledged the E911 Revenues for the full and prompt payment of the principal of and interest on this Note.

The County reserves the right to prepay principal of this Note, in whole or in part, at any time prior to and in any order of maturity on terms of par and accrued interest. All principal so prepaid shall cease to bear interest on the prepayment date.

This Note is fully negotiable but shall be fully registered as to both principal and interest in the name of the owner on the books of the County in the office of the Registrar, after which no transfer shall be valid unless made on said books and then only upon presentation of this Note to the Registrar, together with either a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Registrar or the assignment form hereon completed and duly executed by the registered owner or the duly authorized attorney for such registered owner.

The Registrar and the Paying Agent may deem and treat the registered owner hereof as the absolute owner for the purpose of receiving payment of or on account of principal hereof, premium, if any, and interest due hereon and for all other purposes, and the Registrar and the Paying Agent shall not be affected by any notice to the contrary.

And It Is Hereby Certified and Recited that all acts, conditions and things required by the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa, to exist, to be had, to be done or to be performed precedent to and in the issue of this Note were and have been properly existent, had, done and performed in regular and due form and time.

Section 5. It is the intention of the County that interest on the Note be and remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the appropriate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the Treasury Regulations in effect with respect thereto (all of the foregoing herein referred to as the "Internal Revenue Code"). In furtherance thereof, the County covenants to comply with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code as they may from time to time be in effect or amended and further covenants to comply with the applicable future laws, regulations, published rulings and court decisions as may be necessary to insure that the interest on the Note will remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes. Any and all of the officers of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions as may be necessary to comply with the covenants herein contained.

The County hereby designates the Note as a "Qualified Tax Exempt Obligation" as that term is used in Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Section 6. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
